Overview

Northern Arizona University ranks 31 out of 257 schools in the 2026 College Free Speech Rankings. The university posts a score of 68, which earns a D+ speech climate grade. Strong written policies continue to help: NAU earns a "green light" Spotlight rating and has adopted the Chicago Statement, but these formal commitments have not yet translated into a healthier speech climate.

NAU places in the bottom 25 for both "Self-Censorship" and "Openness," indicating that many students feel pressure to keep quiet on controversial issues and shy away from tough conversations.

NAU could strengthen its overall climate by adopting an official commitment to institutional neutrality and by developing programs that promote constructive, viewpoint-diverse dialogue, giving students greater confidence to speak their minds.
