Overview

Pomona College ranks 247 out of 257 schools in the 2026 College Free Speech Rankings, earning a score of 49 and an F speech climate grade. This marks the fourth straight year Pomona has landed in failing territory, and its continuing "yellow light" Spotlight rating keeps a consistent policy penalty on the books.

Students offer a mixed picture. Pomona places in the top 25 for "Openness," indicating relative ease discussing many controversial topics. At the same time, the college ranks in the bottom 25 for "Political Tolerance," "Disruptive Conduct," and "Administrative Support," reflecting low willingness to host opposing speakers, higher acceptance of shout-downs, and scant confidence in administrators.

Pomona could improve by revising its written speech policies to earn a "green light" Spotlight rating, adopting a free speech statement based on the Chicago Statement, and adopting an official commitment to institutional neutrality."
