## Overview

Scripps College ranks 209 out of 257 schools in the 2026 College Free Speech Rankings. The college earned a score of 53, identical to last year, and an F speech climate grade. Its policies still earn a “yellow light” Spotlight rating, and the school has not adopted the Chicago Statement or an official statement on institutional neutrality.

Scripps places in the top 25 for both “Openness” and “Self-Censorship,” indicating that comparatively fewer students feel pressured to silence themselves. Those bright spots are offset by serious weaknesses: the college places in the bottom 25 for “Political Tolerance” and “Administrative Support,” and in the bottom 50 for “Comfort Expressing Ideas.”

Scripps could improve by revising its written speech policies to earn a “green light” Spotlight rating, adopting a free speech statement based on the Chicago Statement, officially committing to institutional neutrality, and clearly signaling administrative support for a broader range of speakers on campus.
