Overview

University of Connecticut ranks 215 out of 257 schools in the 2026 College Free Speech Rankings with a score of 53, an F speech climate grade. Its policies still earn a "yellow light" Spotlight rating, and the university has yet to endorse either the Chicago Statement or an official commitment to institutional neutrality.

UConn places in the bottom 25 for both "Comfort" and "Self-Censorship," and in the bottom 50 for "Openness." These results suggest many students keep quiet rather than risk speaking their minds.

UConn could improve by revising its written speech policies to earn a "green light" Spotlight rating, adopting a free speech statement based on the Chicago Statement, and adopting an official commitment to institutional neutrality.
