


Overview

Loyola University Chicago ranks 248 out of 257 schools in the 2026 College Free Speech Rankings with a score of 49, sustaining an F speech climate grade. The school still earns a "red light" Spotlight rating, indicating restrictive written speech policies.

Survey responses paint a challenging picture. Loyola places in the bottom 50 nationwide for "Political Tolerance," and no area lands in the top 50.

Loyola could improve by revising its written speech policies to earn a "green light" Spotlight rating, adopting a free speech statement based on the Chicago Statement, and adopting an official commitment to institutional neutrality.
