Overview

Eastern Kentucky University ranks 9 of 257 in the 2026 College Free Speech Rankings, earning a score of 73, a C speech climate grade. The school formally embraced institutional neutrality, a move that added a three-point policy boost while earning a “green light” Spotlight rating.

Student perceptions place EKU in the top 25 for both “Administrative Support” and “Political Tolerance,” signaling greater trust in the administration’s protection of free speech and a greater willingness to host viewpoints across the political spectrum. At the same time, EKU ranks in the bottom 50 for “Openness” to discussing specific controversial issues, suggesting many students are avoiding difficult conversations.

EKU could improve by adopting a free speech statement based on the Chicago Statement and adopting an official commitment to institutional neutrality.
