


Overview

Clark University ranks 194 out of 257 schools in the 2026 College Free Speech Rankings with a score of 55 and an F speech climate grade. The university still earns a "red light" Spotlight rating, signaling restrictive written policies even though it has adopted both the Chicago Statement and institutional neutrality.

Student perceptions place Clark in the top 25 for "Self-Censorship," indicating students censor themselves at a lower rate than other schools. That lone strength is overshadowed by stark weaknesses: the school is in the bottom 25 for both "Political Tolerance," meaning many students believe controversial speakers should not be allowed on campus, and "Administrative Support," showing little faith in leadership's backing of free expression.

Clark could improve by overhauling its speech codes to secure at least a "yellow light" Spotlight rating and by explicitly assuring students that administrators will protect events featuring ideologically diverse speakers.
