



The College Free Speech Rankings are based on student surveys, campus policies, and recent speech-related controversies.







Overview

Barnard College's dead last rank is the result of numerous free speech controversies and the students' perceptions of free speech on campus. Survey data place Barnard near the bottom in five of six key areas. It ranks dead last for both "Comfort Expressing Ideas" and "Administrative Support," with the latter being the worst score in College Free Speech Rankings history. It also lands in the bottom 25 for "Political Tolerance" and "Self-Censorship," and the bottom 50 for "Disruptive Conduct."

Barnard's dismal performance reflects a climate where free expression is neither protected nor prioritized. To rebuild trust, Barnard must overhaul its restrictive speech codes to earn a "green light" Spotlight rating, adopt the Chicago Statement, and commit to institutional neutrality. It should also embed robust First Amendment education into orientation so students understand their rights — and the line between protected speech and unlawful conduct.



FIRE's Spotlight database annually rates regulations on student expression based on the extent to which they restrict free speech.


