Overview

Hamilton College ranks 157 out of 257 schools in the 2026 College Free Speech Rankings, earning a score of 56 and an F speech climate grade. Hamilton earns a “yellow light” Spotlight rating.

Student perceptions place Hamilton in the top 25 for “Self-Censorship,” meaning comparatively few students report keeping quiet about their views. That bright spot is overshadowed by weaknesses: the school lands in the bottom 50 for “Political Tolerance,” signaling limited openness to controversial speakers.

The college could improve by revising its speech codes to earn a “green light” Spotlight rating, as well as adopting the Chicago Statement and an official commitment to institutional neutrality.
