## Overview

Oklahoma State University ranks 90 out of 257 schools in the 2026 College Free Speech Rankings with a score of 60, a D- speech climate grade. The school received a small bonus after administrators publicly defended a student group's right to post "DEI – Deport Every Illegal" flyers. The school retains a "yellow light" Spotlight rating and has not adopted the Chicago Statement or an official commitment to institutional neutrality.

Student perceptions place OSU in the top 25 for "Political Tolerance" and in the top 50 for "Administrative Support," suggesting a comparatively greater willingness to host controversial speakers and some trust in campus leadership. However, the university ranks in the bottom 10 on "Openness," continuing a pattern of reluctance to discuss certain hot-button issues.

OSU could strengthen its overall climate by revising its speech policies to earn a "green light" Spotlight rating and formally adopting the Chicago Statement and an official commitment to institutional neutrality.
