Overview

Lafayette College ranks 232 out of 257 schools in the 2026 College Free Speech Rankings with a score of 51, an F speech climate grade. The college still earns a “red light” Spotlight rating, and its overall standing changed little from last year.

Even so, students offer a mixed picture. Lafayette places in the top 25 for “Political Tolerance” and in the top 50 for both “Self-Censorship” and “Openness,” hinting at a willingness to hear differing views and speak up for themselves. At the same time, the college ranks in the bottom 50 for “Disruptive Conduct,” reflecting greater acceptance of shout-downs, and for “Administrative Support,” suggesting limited confidence in campus leaders to defend free expression.

Lafayette could make quick progress by revising its speech policies to earn a “green light” Spotlight rating and formally adopting the Chicago Statement on free expression.

77% of students say shouting down a speaker to prevent them from speaking on campus is acceptable, at least in rare cases.



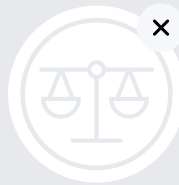
43% of students say using violence to stop someone from speaking on campus is acceptable, at least in rare cases.
