Overview

Pennsylvania State University ranks 109 out of 257 schools in the 2026 College Free Speech Rankings with a score of 58. The Nittany Lions leapt 119 places from last year's 228 as Penn State stopped adding speech controversy penalties, yet it still earns a "yellow light" Spotlight rating.

Student perceptions place Penn State in the top 10 for "Political Tolerance" and in the top 50 for perceived "Administrative Support," suggesting a campus willing to host speakers across the political spectrum at a greater rate than other campuses — and an administration viewed as somewhat supportive.

Penn State could make decisive progress by revising its speech codes to earn a "green light" Spotlight rating and by publicly adopting the Chicago Statement and an official commitment to institutional neutrality to affirm free expression.



FIRE's Spotlight database annually rates regulations on student expression based on the extent to which they restrict free speech.
