Overview

Texas Tech University ranks 102 out of 257 schools in the 2026 College Free Speech Rankings. Its score is 59, with an F speech climate grade.

Student perceptions were mixed. Texas Tech ranks in the top 25 for “Administrative Support,” signaling comparatively greater confidence that leadership backs expressive rights, and in the top 50 for “Political Tolerance,” indicating relative willingness to host controversial speakers from across the political spectrum. At the same time, the school ranks in the bottom 50 for “Openness,” meaning many students felt wary discussing particular hot-button issues.

Texas Tech could strengthen its standing by adopting the Chicago Statement and an official commitment to institutional neutrality, along with overhauling its policies to replace the current “yellow light” Spotlight rating with a “green light.”
