## Overview

University of California, Merced ranks 147 out of 257 schools in the 2026 College Free Speech Rankings with a score of 57 and an F speech climate grade. The campus's Spotlight rating is still a "yellow light." The school has yet to adopt the Chicago Statement.

Students surveyed poorly on protest norms, placing UC Merced in the bottom 50 for "Disruptive Conduct," indicating support for shout-downs and similar tactics, while UC Merced's rankings for other areas were middling.

UC Merced could improve by revising speech codes to earn a "green light" Spotlight rating, adopting the Chicago Statement and an official commitment to institutional neutrality.
